PARKWAY VS **CRIBBS**

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to Bolitho Park for today's game with Cribbs and in particular, a warm welcome to their management, staff, players and supporters. We hope they enjoy their time with us today and have a safe journey home.

Due to last season being declared null and void we didn't face Cribbs at all last season and they will have no doubt made some personnel changes since our last encounters in 2018/19 when we ran out 2-0 winners in both games. I note they have made a solid start to the season and remain undefeated in their 5 games with victories in the first 2 qualifying rounds of the FA Cup along with a 6-1 victory at home to Bridport and draws with Keynsham Town and Clevedon in the league where they currently lie 7th. If we are to build on our encouraging start to the league campaign, as always, we will need to be at our best this afternoon to maintain our early momentum.

Since my last notes we have gained victories over Exmouth Town and Chipping Sodbury. I thought in the first half against Exmouth we played our best football so far this season and had our final ball and finishing been better we could have been more than 1-0 ahead at the break. The second half saw the other side of our game when we had to dig in, defend solidly in numbers and work hard against a strong, physical Exmouth outfit. Our

2nd goal midway through the second half gave us some breathing space and we managed to see the game out for a hard earned 3 points and a clean sheet. However I was disappointed with some aspects of our discipline which resulted in an unnecessary but no arguments straight red card in stoppage time which means starting today, River Allen will miss our next 3 games. Add 3 yellows in that game to the 5 picked up in the previous 2 games, we can ill afford to continue to pick up cautions, sometimes for petty offences and dissent, and incur early season suspensions. We must also remember the sin bin procedure is still in operation. The players have been reminded of the importance of keeping their discipline and I hope to see an improvement in this area.

Our victory at Chipping Sodbury was a game of 2 halves after a disjointed 1st half performance with only a slender half time 1-0 lead to show for our efforts having scored just before the break. We were much improved in the 2nd half and 3 more goals at regular intervals saw us gain a comfortable 4-0 victory with another clean sheet with which I was very pleased.

As most of you will know unfortunately Steve Colwell sustained a broken ankle in the Hallen game and at the time of writing it is not known for how long he will be unavailable. We also have a couple of players who either did not have a full pre season or are still carrying minor injuries which

has forced us to rotate the squad and also play some players in unfamiliar positions. This is not ideal but the players have shown a good attitude and responded well to the changes. To that end we have reinforced the squad and registered some players as cover. These include Levi Landricombe who has decided to leave Tiverton and who I'm sure is familiar to you all and Nick Hurst who is currently on a break from working abroad but has past experience with Bodmin, Tiverton and Truro. Both played the full 90 minutes at Chipping Sodbury. This week we have also signed on a permanent basis Craig Veal from Willand Rovers. Craig is an experienced, versatile striker who has had spells playing at a higher level with Bideford, Bridgwater and Taunton before returning to Willand. Craig is a welcome addition the squad and I'm sure you'll join me in welcoming him to the club.

In an intense start to the season we have now completed 4 of our 8 games in a busy September. With only the FA Cup defeat after penalties and 3 out of 3 league victories with only 1 goal conceded and that from a penalty, Matt and I are reasonably pleased with our start but there is clearly room for improvement.

We have played very well at times, dug in at others but with a number of new players in the squad it takes time for them to gel and form partnerships and we are yet to have a fully fit squad from which to pick. It is still very, very early days and we will not get carried away and come the end of September we'll see where we are and by then we should have a clearer picture of other teams squads and their strengths and weaknesses.

Enjoy the game and may the best team win.

LETS KEEP PLAYING, KEEP WATCHING AND FOLLOW THE GUIDANCE

The Toolstation Western League is asking fans to support their local football clubs on and off the field this season by observing the Covid-19 guidance. Whilst specific guidance varies from Club to Club, depending on their facilities, supporters are being asked to observe social distancing and avoid close contact with others not in their social or support bubble.

If fans need to access any of the ground's amenities, such as toilets, food and drink outlets, they should check to see if any of them are not in use, and plan accordingly. George's message to fans is simple, "let's keep playing, keep watching and follow the guidance. We all have a part to play in defeating the virus, especially fans. Don't wait to be told what to do. Use your common sense and support your local Club by helping the volunteers make sure that everything is Covid compliant. Remember that whatever your hope for your Club this season, Covid-19 is the one opponent we all want to beat."

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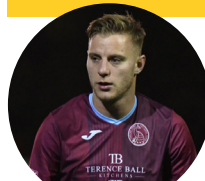

THE LAWNS TOOLSTATION WESTERN LEAGUE

Cribbs Football Club (Cribbs FC) are currently in their 59th season since they were founded back in London in 1958 as 'Sun Life Assurance'. The Bristol team was established in 1976 when Sun Life first relocated to Bristol.

Initially they ran two teams in the Bristol and Avon League, playing at Dundridge Farm. However, when the Cribbs Causeway (now The Lawns) ground was opened in 1978, the 1st team were promoted straight to the Avon Premier Combination League where they stayed for 20 years until they eventually won promotion to the Gloucestershire County League by winning the re-named Bristol Premier Combination in the 1999/2000 season.

Today the Club runs four Saturday sides (until 2004/2005 season there were five Saturday sides), spread across the Toolstation Western, Bristol Premier Combination and Bristol & District Leagues. On a Sunday we have 1 side in the Regional League Premier Division (who won the Gilbert Pullin Sunday Cup in 2003/2004 & 2013/2014 season and were runners up in 2006/2007 season) and 1 Vets side who play in the Casuals League. In addition, we have run one Under 18's team for five seasons in the Bristol North Division of the Bristol Premier Combination U18's league. At

the start of the 2012/2013 season this was increased to two Under 18's teams with the formation of the Colts who play in the Bristol Central Division of the league.

The progress of the club continued on an upward trend during the 2015/2016 season with the first team finishing a respectable 15th in their first season in the Premier Division of the Toolstation League. The reserves were runners up to Mendip Broadwalk in a thrilling finale to the Premier Division of the Bristol Premier Combination. The 3rd team also finished runners up in Division One of the Bristol & District league which as a result meant promotion to the Senior Division for the 2016/2017 season. The Sunday team won the Regional League Cup. The Under 18's also won their league and were runners up in the league cup.

The club is well known for the tremendous facilities. The England Under 21 side then managed by Peter Taylor trained at the ground in 1997 and indeed played a Cribbs FC (then AXA) side prior to their game with Italy. There have also been two games televised on Sky Sports Soccer AM programme between Cribbs FC (then AXA) teams & celebrity sides. Our groundsman has won the national FA Groundsman of The Year Award for Step 5 & 6 in 2014 & 2016 and he has also been nominated again for the 2017 awards.

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MATCH REPORT

Parkway travelled to Chipping Sodbury in a rearranged fixture brought forward from late October looking to maintain their promising start to their league campaign. 3 changes were made to the starting line up from the midweek victory over Exmouth Town with Jordan Bentley, Levi Landricombe and Nick Hurst starting in place of Matt Wright, Mikey Williams and Michael Landricombe who were all named among the substitutes.

Shane Krac remains unavailable due to injury. Parkway made a quick start and on 3 minutes almost took the lead. A through ball from Harrison Davis found Levi Landricombe in the clear only for his attempted first time lob from 18 yards fall safely into the hands of Chris Simsek in the home goal. In their first attack on 8 minutes the hosts struck back and almost went ahead with only a last ditch goal line clearance by Rob Farkins, after some hesitant and chaotic defending, prevented them from doing so. With the hosts looking lively on the flanks, they created another chance on 10 minutes with Kyle Moore comfortably saving a long range effort. Parkway began to dominate the midfield but were often guilty of conceding possession too easily with their final ball lacking quality and precision.

Chipping Sodbury continued to compete well without creating any clear chances with the game lacking fluidity with too many misplaced passes, overhit long balls and neither keeper being called into action.

Parkway looked to use the flanks and switch play whilst remaining patient but were unable to penetrate the home defence who remained strong. A lengthy delay whilst the home keeper received treatment broke up play as the game lacked any real quality as Parkway huffed and puffed but rarely tested a struggling Simsek.

On 32 minutes a curling free kick from 25 yards by River Allen clipped the outside of the post followed by a neat exchange between Hurst and Ryan Richards being deflected behind for a corner as Parkway looked for an opening. The resultant corner was cleared to the edge of the 18 area where Farkins hit a rising effort narrowly over. Little was seen of Chipping Sodbury as an attacking threat but the pacey Josh Pandolfino looked lively but invariably lacked support in the final third with Parkway defending comfortably. On 35 minutes a Parkway break along the right saw Callum Hall link well with Richards whose cross was headed just wide by Hurst. Parkway continued to squander possession in midfield however a period of pressure saw them win a couple of corners and from one on the left they took the lead on 43 minutes when Bentley climbed highest at the far post to power home a header.

They almost doubled the lead a minute later when a delicate lob by Richards skimmed the bar after good work by Allen. The final action of the half saw the hosts Ben Chick receive the game's first yellow card after a cynical trip on Hall as he attempted to break through from midfield. A stuttering, generally uninspiring first half from Parkway whose game lacked fluency and a cutting edge and despite having the lion's share of possession, they were unable to test Simsek in the home goal too often. An early break in the second half saw the hosts Kalam Youngsham fire an angled drive just over on 47 minutes as Parkway looked to up their tempo from the first half and attempt to control the game. With Parkway now looking much sharper and positive, good work between Allen and Billy Palfrey released Levi Landricombe whose shot was blocked by the keeper before another break along the left saw Hurst cut inside and again test Simsek.

A rare break by the hosts on 53 minutes resulted in some hesitant defending which saw them win a corner from which Aaron Stevens free header flew narrowly over. Chipping Sodbury made their first substitution on 54 minutes with Keene Ashwood replacing Frankie Grieveson. Hurst was then put in the clear and cleverly rounded the keeper only for his heavy touch to get away from him with his shot from a narrow angle going into the side netting. Parkway continued to dominate but play remained generally scrappy as they looked to increase their lead.

On 59 minutes Michael Landricombe replaced Hall in midfield and made an almost immediate impact. On 63 minutes a determined Richards broke clear along the left with his dangerous cross only being cleared as far as Landricombe who, unmarked, smashed home an unstoppable volley from around 15 yards. The hosts then made their final substitutions with Darren Jeffries replacing Jordan Clark and Corey King coming on for Pandolfino.

Parkway's second goal seemed to release the tension and they started playing with much more confidence, moving the ball around at pace with more penetration against a tiring defence and it was no surprise when they increased their lead further. On 68 minutes good work between Allen and Davis along the right saw a cross from Allen cutely dummied by Michael Landricombe to brother Levi who does what he does best and crashed home a shot from around 12 yards.

With Parkway now in full flow, on 70 minutes Allen broke clear and shot wide when he had better options available in support. James Ward replaced Davis for Parkway on 73 minutes as they continued to dominate despite the tempo of the game dropping. On 76 minutes they should have gone further ahead when a strong run down the left by Hurst saw him pull the ball back to Richards some 6 yards out only for him to uncharacteristically spoon his shot over the bar.

Chipping Sodbury remained on the back foot, rarely threatening and on 80 minutes Richards finally got the goal his hard working,

selfless performance deserved. A pin point cross field ball to Allen on the right saw his dangerous cross pick out Ryan Lane whose shot was parried with Richards reacting quickest to hammer home the rebound low into the corner from around 10 yards. With Parkway now content to slow the pace and retain and control possession, on 85 minutes the strong running and lively substitute King saw Moore easily save his shot as Parkway comfortably saw the game out. After a rather insipid, disjointed first half against limited but willing, hardworking opponents who never gave up, a much improved second half performance from Parkway saw them run out comfortable winners to make it out 3 wins out of 3 and top the table as early pacesetters.

There remains a long, long way to go with plenty of room for improvement as the much changed squad begin to gel, recover from injuries and get up to full match fitness but the early signs are encouraging. With an intense start to the season and 4 games having been played in the first 12 days, Parkway now have a rest and recovery week before entertaining Cribbs in another all ticket game at Bolitho Park next Saturday.
